1. U. S. Corps of Engineers and U. S. contractors, which organizations have their own motor transport service.
2. Personnel residing in Mission-operated hotels.
3. Personnel having privately owned vehicles operating under Embassy or Mission licenses.

- b. Padlocks with duplicate keys have been obtained in sufficient quantity to issue one to each entitled household. Any additional locks required must be provided by the household.
- c. Sufficient load carrying vehicles have been obtained to carry out this service.

Procedure

After completion of shopping the purchaser will pack or supervise the packing of purchases in one or more of the boxes available for this purpose. The box or boxes should be locked and labeled personally by the purchaser. The label should give full name and most complete address, including area, as: Phloxton, Psycho, Kolanuki, Maili, etc. Labels will be provided at the Community.

Deliveries will begin on the following schedules and will be made as expeditiously as possible:

1. Kaitiaki-Kokoi area, including Amareston and Kaitiaki:
Monday, 2:30 p.m.; Wednesday, 12:00 noon; Friday, 2:30 p.m.
2. Central Athens: Same schedule as above.
3. Psycho-Kalanderin: Tuesday, 2:30 p.m.; Thursday, 2:30 p.m.; Saturday, 11:30 a.m.

4. Glaxia-Phloxton area: Same schedule as 3 above.

It is anticipated that it may take as long as four hours from the beginning of the delivery schedule until the last delivery is made. Arrangements, however, will be worked out so that houses receiving deliveries last on one day will receive deliveries first on the following delivery day. In light of the foregoing, early shoppers may desire to carry with them perishable items.

Immediately on delivery the purchaser should be unpacked and boxes re-templated being home when delivery is made, duplicate key should be left with household staff to insure rapid unloading and return of boxes, so as not to cause delay in delivery schedule.

No responsibility will be accepted nor claims entertained for any shortages or spoilages which may occur.

The cost of this service will be 5,000 drachmas for each delivery made. Billing will be made every two weeks by the Budget and Fiscal Section. The above amount is subject to change on basis of future experience.

Applicability

The provisions of this order will apply to all employees of the U. S. Embassy, AEC, and RCA/G, except that delivery service will not be available to the following categories:

Subject: COMMISSARY DELIVERY SERVICE

Purpose

The purpose of this order is to inaugurate a delivery system for Commissary purchases on a limited and restricted basis, and to discontinue providing passenger vehicles from the Motor Pool for the purpose of Commissary shopping.

Effective September 27, 1948, it will be the policy of Joint Administrative Services not to provide vehicles to transport employees or their dependents to the Commissary. All employees will be expected to use the authorized bus service or to provide their own transportation for travel to and from the Commissary. As of the same date it will be the policy to provide limited delivery service of Commissary purchases on a payment basis.

General

1. Transportation

- a. Residents of the Kifissia-Ekali area are authorized to utilize the Sub Motor Pool at Kifissia for transportation between their homes and the bus terminal at the Palace Hotel.
- b. Residents of Psychico will utilize bus route as announced in JAS Order No. 15.
- c. Shoppers from the areas in "a" and "b" above can make contact at the King George bus terminal with the King George line, which operates every half hour from the King George and which has a stop at the Commissary.
- d. Residents of the Glafada-Phaleron area will use established bus line which has a stop at the new Commissary location.

2. Equipment

- a. Boxes, a quantity of good quality boxes equipped with hinged lids, handles and humps have been constructed for use in implementing this service.

4. THE FOURTH OBJECT WAS TO
CONSIDER THE LIMITATIONS OF
THE RESEARCH AND TO SUGGEST
FURTHER RESEARCH.

CONCLUSIONS

RESULTS

THE RESULTS OF THE RESEARCH
INDICATE THAT THE EFFECTS OF
VARIABLES A AND B ON THE
DEPENDENT VARIABLE C ARE
SIGNIFICANTLY DIFFERENT FROM
ZERO. THE DATA OBTAINED
FROM THE EXPERIMENTAL DESIGN
ARE IN GOOD AGREEMENT WITH
THE RESULTS OF THE THEORETICAL
MODEL.

THE LIMITATIONS OF THE
RESEARCH ARE AS FOLLOWS:
1. THE SAMPLE SIZE WAS
SMALL.

DISCUSSION

THE RESULTS OF THE RESEARCH

INDICATE THAT THE EFFECTS OF
VARIABLES A AND B ON THE
DEPENDENT VARIABLE C ARE
SIGNIFICANTLY DIFFERENT FROM
ZERO.
